Freedom is never voluntarily given by the oppressor. It must be demanded by the oppressed. Dr King knew that true freedom required not just external liberation, but an inner freedom rooted in the divine despite the cost, he feared nothing, because he knew he walked in the truth of God's justice and love. Even

more, look at early Christians who were persecuted by the Roman Empire, stripped of their homes, families and sometimes their lives. They sang hymns in prison to face martyrdom with peace, because they knew the freedom they had in Christ was worth more than anything the world could take from them, words and

ideas, oh my, they are the most effective weapon against oppression. Freedom is not the absence of challenges. It is the presence of God. When you choose him. He equips you with everything you need. According to this belief, Heaven bestowed its mandate upon a just ruler, the son of Heaven. The mandate of heaven depends on the virtue of the Emperor. If he does not fulfill his obligations as emperor, then he loses the mandate, and thus the right to be emperor, the mandate. Of heaven would have transferred

whoever would rule best. The fact that a ruler was overthrown was taken by itself as an indication that the ruler had lost a mandate of heaven. In addition, it was also common belief that natural disasters such as famine and flood were the signs of Heaven's displeasure with the current

ruler. So there would have been revolts following major environmental events, as citizens saw these assigns as Heaven's displeasure. The mandate of heaven does not require that a legitimate ruler be of noble birth. The dynasties were often founded by people of common birth, such as the Han

Dynasty and the Ming Dynasty. The mandate of heaven had no time limitations, depending instead upon the just and able performance of a ruler and his heirs. Throughout the history of China, times of poverty and natural disaster were often taken as signs that having considered the incumbent ruler

unjust and thus in need of replacement, the concept of the mandate of heaven was first used to support the rule of the kings of the Zhao dynasty from 1046, to 256, BC, and their overthrow of the earlier Shang Dynasty, the mandate of heaven was a well accepted and popular idea among the people of China, since it

argued for the removal of incompetent or despotic rulers and provided an incentive for rulers to rule Well unjustly. The concept was often invoked by philosophers and scholars in ancient China, as well as to curtail the abuses of power by the ruler in a system that otherwise offered few checks to

his power. Chinese historians interpreted accessible revolt as evidence that the mandate of heaven had passed in China, the right of the rebellion against an unjust ruler had been a part of the political philosophy ever since the Shao dynasty, and the successful rebellion was interpreted by Chinese

historians as evidence that the divine approval had passed on to the success of dynasty. The right of rebellion is not coded into any official law. Rather, rebellion is always outlawed and severely punished, but still is a positive right grounded in the Chinese moral system. Often it is used as justification for the

actions to overthrow a previous dynasty after Rebellion has been successful and a new dynastic rule has been established since the winner is the one who determines who has attained the mandate of heaven and who has lost it. Some Chinese scholars consider it to be a sort of victor's justice, best

characterized by the popular Chinese saying, the winner becomes king and the loser becomes outlaw.

I'm just telling you, and it's like, so cool, because if you look at it, the Athenians were like, democratic, but aristocratic Democrats, right? They were like, Yeah, we listened to you,

but you know, we know better than you. So they kind of do like this, okay, I'll take it. And sometimes they used to always take, you know, the information that people would give them. I have to give them that because they were really into philosophy, and this is why they advanced so much, because

they allowed different people to be heard and seen and and and contribute, but see, they're what the Democrats pretend to be, and the Spartans were actually the conservatives. And if you know anything about geography, and that's so cool, because my DNA tells you like 94% literally from the

Peloponnese, literally Spartan, even though my whole family is in a Corinthia, right? And so Megara, which is like from Athens all the way up to the Corinthian canal today, which is where we reside, which is probably the residual from that war, totally. Ah, right. Here's, here's the, here's the freaky

thing. So the Spartans were extremely conservative, but they weren't the conservative that you see, like the losers that you see online. Women were actually highly regarded as generals. They were the strategists. The men were the muscle. The women knew their plays. It's like, I'm the neck

and you're the head, and I tell you where to turn. And they were always the ones putting out strategy, but they all also kept home. So they were the ones that were really the bureaucrats, right? So the watch, the wives, things probably came from there, and that's why all the wars back then started with women. But

anyway, Megara was like, if you would see it like on the map in the US, I would say it would be like the Midwest slash, Mid East, right, maybe Tennessee, Kentucky in there, right, northern Georgia. And then the Conservatives would be like Texas. You know, the southeast states. You know, Georgia is

kind of becoming more a middle a little bit up the coast, and then it's like crazy ass Athens, right, everywhere. And so what Megara has served was two purposes. One, they would, you know, keep distance between the Spartans and the Athenians. Because remember, if you look at it on a micro scale. It was only

the country of Greece, but now, if you expand it, and you look at it on the US, it will totally make sense. Megara was in the in between the swing states, the ones that were profitable and still maintain some sort of order with conservative values, but they would also pander to the democratic values that

Athens had, which were more liberal, and this would allow them to keep their farms and keep easy. And they would also separate the Spartans from the theme Thebans right from thieves FIBA right to not allow them to grow alliances. Now, demos did one fucking freaky ass thing, and I needed to find out why

they fucked up, right? I needed to find out whether I found the source of the fuck up, and it's the same damn source today, and it was the same damn source before. It was the source before that. And I can out, you know, this thing is probably going to be turned into fiction, because it's going to piss a lot of

people off, but Dima send us the one general, the not TV general, right? Was like, Yo, we need to, like, take these Spartans and and just, you know, put them in order, right? Put them in order. Tell them who's boss, and tell them they're not allowed to do these things. So what he did was he created this fort, right, the

stronghold he had called pilos, and in the town of pilos, he had this fort, but it turned out it was just a sanctuary city. Are you paying attention to what I'm telling you? It was a fucking sanctuary city. And basically there, there were defectors from the Spartans that were thinking more like Athenian. Americans.

There were people from everywhere else that kind of thought more like Athenians, and they were like slaves, because the Spartans were like, Dude, you like, don't know what your gender is. Like, you can't hang out with us like, we don't want you. I'm sorry. I'm sorry you don't even speak English. Did

they just ship you off here from Africa? I'm sorry you can't just intertwine with our society. You know, people were like that. They were hard conservatives in Sparta, a little too hard sometimes, but you know, whatever, whatever, whatever floats your boat, there was no middle ground. So what happened

was, you know, General De Mistenez was a genius because he created that, and that created this

issue with the infrastructure of Sparta. Sparta, don't get me wrong, was is a city now in Greece, as you know, but it was a city state. It was a state, state of a united Greek empire, kind of like China is now the People's Republic from five states, right? Crazy. All these big powers have come. They

started as states, and then they evolved either to a power, or they fall precipice right here. So pay attention. So he found out that if he created enough of these sanctuary cities that he would be able to topple them. But guess what? There were people funding these fucking wars guys. Oh, my God, I found

out that they were and I found this out from freaking a Saudi journal. My mind was like, it was like, talking about the Silk Road, and then it was funded. So there were these two people that were literally funding the War of the Greek Empire. Stop. It's like they had their own George Soros. Well, actually, the

simile is fun. Jewel brothers, you know, the two brothers that fund the Democrats and Republicans kind of like that, but on a bigger scale. So one guy was like, they were, they were funding both of the generals and giving gold and stuff so they can get an army, and they would give them bodies

Was like, No, we need the Greeks to the Athenians to whether that we are leaders of the world. And blah, blah, blah, blah, blah, and we're going to show them, and we're going to go in there,

and we're going to go with war. We're going to have bases everywhere we need to show and flag. that I found out from Pakistani history, and here's where I saw it. I thought, I'll leave you with this this evening, with these two videos. I really want you to see them, because this is history that you probably don't even know of, and the more I think of it, the more I I realize, so mythology is history

from yay. Then that, you know, we kind of don't like, or can't explain with whatever things we're selling to people today, so we kind of do, yeah, it's mythological. So it makes sense, right? Look, but this is going to blow your mind. So let's see this Chinese guy tell you about how the world started, right? So

you heard about the the the mandate of God, where he said, You are the Son of God, right? But you will only be the Son of God if you abide by these rules. Wait. Are you saying that they had their own Jesus, moment too, 8000 years ago? Wait. It gets better.

Watch this of the universe and the race of humankind. Divine Beings descended down from the heavens and taught the first humans important knowledge about life. The first of these gods descended, and they were called the three sovereigns and the five emperors, and they brought about a period when the gods

lived alongside humankind. Over the course of history, there are many discussions about who these three sovereigns are, but regardless of who they actually are, the three sovereigns each represent a part of our world, which are heaven, earth and the people. The first sovereign is fu Shi, or fu Shi. Fu xi is his

name, and Shi, in ancient China, actually refers to Shen Qi, or a god or deity, and the meaning of Shu nowadays is actually family name or clan name. According to archeology studies, the clan of fu Xu actually lived in today's Gansu and Xinjiang province, which is sort of like the western China. Fu Xu taught

humans to fish, to hunt, and he created a simple order of government. He also created words and language clan or family names, further improved marriage rights and created the instruments of Xiao and Yao Qing. All of these things are important to human society as they taught us how to live and

survive on our own through a simple government, along with officials, order was brought to society through fishing and hunting, a food source was established. Words and language helped with communication and marriage rights distinguished humans apart from animals, music was also a big part of Chinese

traditional culture. In ancient Chinese the word for medicine, it actually enclosed the word Yue, or music in it. It is believed in ancient China that listening to beautiful and calming music would help soothe the mind and bring peace to the body. But I will be doing a video specifically on how music

can actually help you cure illnesses in the future. Apart from these achievements, Fushi also rediscovered Huo to and Luo Shu. It was believed that one day when Fushi was along the banks of the Yellow River, a long ma, or a dragon horse came to him carrying the diagram of hetu. And from this diagram of

the heotou Fauci created the Eight Trigrams, or Bagua. Another time, a giant turtle came out from the river and the diagram of Luo Shu was engraved onto the back of the turtle. These two diagrams, heotou and Luo Shu, were to contain secrets of our universe, and whoever can decipher the message from these

two diagrams will have the ability to predict the future and know the will of Heaven. I will make a video later on explaining the importance of the I Ching, The Eight Trigrams and how they can help you predict the future. Sure another important sovereign is Shen Nong, or also known as the

divine farmer, Rickards said that he had a human face, but the features of a dragon. He also had a crystal clear abdomen, where you can clearly see everything happening inside of his organs, everything he ate, you can see it clearly running down his stomach and into his intestines. You can

also see all the chemical reactions inside his body as well. Legends have it that just after six hours, the divine farmer was born, he was able to talk, and after five days, he was able to walk, and on the seventh day, all of his teeth were fully grown. From the name, you can probably tell what the

divine farmer did. The Divine farmer taught people how to cultivate crops, and he also invented a variety of tools used for farming, and that created a stable source of food for the people. He also tasted many different types of herbs and plants found in the wild. His crystal clear belly allowed him

to see the properties of these herbs and plants and how they can affect the human body. One story says that the divine farmer with taste test many different poisonous herbs and plants, and once he even tasted over 72 different kinds of poisonous herbs in one day. But luckily, a leaf from a nearby

bush or tree fell into a pot of boiling water, and that pot of boiling water later on cured all the toxins from his body. And believe it or not. This was the origin of tea, the original antidote for poisons. The Divine farmer spread his knowledge and documented over 360 different plants and herbs that are

beneficial for the human body. Most of his works are documented in the book Shen Nong bin Tao Jing, and that was the beginning of Chinese traditional medicine. Apart from his achievements in agriculture and medicine, the divine farmer also invented the Wu xianxin, which is an ancient instrument that has five

strings. The Divine farmer also invented pottery silk and taught the people how to cook raw meat before eating once, he even set out on a journey to discover the secrets of immortality. And there he met Tai Yi Jin Jin, who is a primordial Taoist deity. And this deity taught the divine farmer the secrets to being

immortal. Tai Yi Jin en told divine farmer to be an upright person, to cultivate your character and virtue, only then can you transcend the mortal body. Only following the righteous path can you succeed like the sun and moon. It is because they follow their paths that they can last this long

after the divine farmer and Fauci there are many debates about who the third sovereign is. Some people say that the third sovereign was Ashley, who created the humans, and some say otherwise. Now, I would strongly urge to kind of look at videos, look at what

people say, but also read, because people don't slow down to read. When you slow down to actually read, you know, you kind of digest things. And one method that I learned if i. To understand things, even though I don't read out all the words I read out loud, and that actually gives the auditory feedback to

yourself as well. Now here's another one. Now the three, you know, sovereigns are also called the three Augusts. So I found another cool video, which has, like, a great animation that will run through this, because a lot of people didn't even know that. You know, this is a thing, and remember, they've been

around for 8000 years. So why are we focusing on Rome? And you know, then you have to think of the Greeks, and that's something that I actually brought up when I was in Greece at the university, speaking with one of the professors at the university, so I could see those old books, because I had friends

that let me see them. What was fascinating, right, was his response to me. I said, Well, you know, our history is weird. I said, because we appeared in Greece, and, you know, this is where the history starts. And I'm like, using these gloves that were, like, too big for my fingers, so it's hard to flip

the page. And he was like, it's like, the way my boyfriend acts when he sees me touching his collectible NFL or basketball card. She's like, No, don't that's a \$2,000 and I'm like, it's a freaking trading card. So it's the same face he gave me. But I flipped the page and I said, there's no bronze in

Greece. So how did Greeks have bronze? Did they import it? So that would allude that they had trade with countries that had bronze. Where's, I don't see it anywhere in this book that says that they had trade to do these things. So there's something missing here. Who deleted it? He's like, Oh, now we're going

to get into the whole, you know, missing libraries and stuff. And I was like, Yeah, well, you know why? Not a lot of those are answered in other ancient texts. Some are found within the Torah, some, but a lot of them are actually in the Quran, where they, they kind of try to draw it, you know, from the Ramses

period, where they're talking about trade with the Greeks. That's why there's literally a Sura about the Greeks in there, but, and I look at it through a historical perspective. So it was interesting, because this is also interesting listen to this video for

China's first dynasty, the SHA dynasty. Well, in this video, I will talk about the mythical rulers of ancient China, the three Augusts and five emperors. It is unlikely that these people existed. Nevertheless, the narrative is very important, because it tells us about how the Chinese people in the past

made sense of their origin, and they are also considered by Confucius to be moral exemplars whose wisdoms and deeds we need to emulate. I am also laying the groundwork.

Wait, I just want to say something the time that Confucius was around between 551 BC and 479 oh, hey, biscuit, that's my cat, my sick, old cat. He so this is a pretty cool fun fact. Sorry, I got distracted by my cat. He's drinking his water. That's why you hear the water running. For those of you

bitching, he comes first, right? So he was around at the time that the five states of these five emperors, right? That they established these five states. He was around during the time of the Warring States. That's what they call that period of time where they didn't have a dynasty, but they were like

fighting for power to then consolidate into the king dynasty. But we'll get into that in a bit. But listen to

this for us to understand Confucianism better in future episodes. As a bonus, I will also talk about how the Kumon Vietnamese and Korean mythical origins intersect with the Chinese. There are a few different roster lists for the three August and five emperors. In some versions, NIWA is not

part of the list. The Yellow Emperor is bumped up to be one of the three Augusts, and his son Xiaohuang is the first of the five emperors. But for this video, I will use the most commonly accepted version from Sima Qian's record of the Grand Historian, the most influential history book in ancient China.

Wait, oh no, I wanted it. Let me, like, see if I can go back on this video. Okay, so you see now was right? So here's why. Okay, so the other version doesn't have Noah. Nuwa was a female, right? She was one of the females of the founding divinities. And so what happened was she and the other. Divinity,

like, I learned this actually through government education when I was being trained on cultural stuff, and I kind of just bookmark it. And I was like, oh, that's kind of cool. They said they had, like a woman, God, that's kind of dope. But I remember this one guy, he was a he was a staff sergeant,

and he was going down a path to be a chief foreign officer for cultural something, something I ended up working at the State Department Anyway, whatever, um details. He's the one that provoked me with this, right? He's the one that earwig this to me, right? He's like, Well, you know, you know, looking at this

because he said he had done divinity studies, right? And I was like, okay, Staff Sergeant that went to God school, got it right, and I was young, right? Um, he said, you know, they equate her to Lilith the myths of Lilith, which is, like, whatever. And I was like, yeah, those aren't even taught

anymore. Nobody talks about it. She's like a demon. He's like, Well, you know, it was because the two deities got married, that marriage was created that only then is a unity sanction. And he goes and just with this whole Adam and Eve thing, it's like crazy. He said, I was like, Look, that's junk for the brain.

I just need to focus to just get this stuff. Like he was really into it. So I think he should be in his 70s by now, so maybe he's, like, retired, but he was pretty dope, like he was he wasn't woke he was, like, solid on his knowledge, like looking back on that conversation, like I just wanted to say. So this

is, this is this is pretty cool. Now I'm going to shut up, because I just want to just jump in and just give you guys some cool little tidbits there. But it was a woman goddess. So there was the one God, the One God and the Goddess. So let me get into it.

Well, the three Augusts were actually added later by Sima Zhu during the Tang Dynasty, but it still serves as a good reference point. Oh yeah. Before we go forward, let me explain the term Emperor used over here. As we know, Qin Huang is usually called the first emperor of China, but more accurately, he

was the first Huang Di, a title he invented by combining the term Huang and di from the three Augusts and five emperors, Sun Huang W Di. I don't know why they are both translated into emperor, but I will just use the accepted translation to make it easier for everyone. The three Augusts are credited with the

invention of many of China's cultures. They are the cultural heroes of ancient China, while the five emperors are people of outstanding moral virtue who ruled over a great era of peace. Confucius references them a lot in his text, Fauci and Nuwa are the first two of the three August. They were described to

have human heads and Snake bodies. In this record, they are depicted as kings who ruled in different time periods. But in other sources such as Tai ping Yulan, a book written 1000 years later, we can find the version many people are more familiar with. They are often depicted as married brother and sisters and

was claimed to be the creator gods of Chinese people. Well, to be honest, it really was just Nuwa who did most of the job.

Oh, no, okay, I'm sorry. I have to butt in. I'm so sorry I can't. But don't they kind of look like the medicine symbol. I'm just saying, and it's duplicity the female in the male. I'm just saying, just trying to ear wig. You just like that Staff Sergeant did to me. Sorry,

molding humanity out of yellow Earth. But as you can see, there are just a lot of contradictory accounts about these figures. But don't worry, I will address all this discrepancy later in the video. For now, let's just go with the Orthodox narrative. The three Augusts, Fauci, or the Fauci clan, superseded suiryn or

the suiryun clan, and became king after heaven. He was credited with the invention of marriage, hunting, net, fishing, Ba Gua and sacrifice to heaven. NIWA, or the NIWA clans, rule came several generations after Fauci rule. In the last year of nuwas rule, Nuwa fought with the rebellious Lord Gong Gong, who

is known as the Water God in other sources, Gong Gong then also fought with zhurong, who was known as the fire god in other sources, Gong. Gong was defeated, and in his anger, he broke the pillar of heaven. NIWA then fixed the heaven with five colored stones and cut off the legs of a turtle known in other

sources as awe to create the four directions, north, south, east and west. Zenon, or the Xenon clan, came after niwa. His name literally means God farmer, and he was also known as Yan di the flame emperor. He had a man's body and a bull's head. He taught humanity farming, created farming tools, experimented with

herbs by tasting them, and used it for medicine. He also created. Needed markets that allowed people to barter. As for the five emperors, this is where Sima Qian's original text started. The Yellow Emperor, or Huang Di, is known as the ancestor of all Chinese people. He was born a genius and grew up

to be humble. By his generation, Xenon or the sinong clans, power had waned. The Dukes raided and harassed the people, and he couldn't do anything about it, so the Yellow Emperor used weapons of war to punish them. After that, the Lord started to pay homage to the Yellow Emperor instead, except for CEO, the

fiercest one of them all seeing this turn of event, Sen Nong invaded the Dukes. So then the Yellow Emperor came to that defense. He controlled the five elements, cultivated five grains, trained bears, tigers and other animals, and after three battles, he defeated sunong at the Battle of bunshu

en. After that, SEO rebelled, and he was in turn captured and slain at the Battle of Zhuo Lu. The Yellow Emperor then replaced zenong as ruler, and he subdued those who would not submit. It is commonly claimed that the descendants of sunnong and Yellow Emperor intermixed and formed the Chinese people.

That's why they often call themselves the descendants of Yan Huang, as for SEOs clan, some of them stayed and intermixed while the others moved away to form the Miao, or the Kumon minority group in China, the Hmong people actually have a different account of the legend, whether the Yellow

Emperor is depicted as the bad guy and suyo was the hero, but historically, suyo was also worshiped in China as a war god, even by Liu Bang, the first emperor of Han Dynasty. Some French theorists in Korea also claim that su Yeo or chi woo was their ancestor, but it was based on Hwan Dan Gogi, a document

that had been proven to be a forgery. Nevertheless, the idea stuck and can sometimes be seen in popular media. I will talk more about this shared myth later in the video, Huang Di was also commonly credited for creating traditional Chinese medicine and many other things. As I've said before, in another

version, Sao Ho, the son of Yellow Emperor, was actually the first of the five emperors, but in Sima qian's version, his relationship to the other emperors was unclear, although some scholars identified him as his eldest son, xuanzhou, the Yellow Emperor had two sons, xuansha and Chang Yi. The second

of the five emperors was Chang Yi's son, Emperor Quanshu, was calm, collected and well versed in all matters. He recorded the seasons, the movements of heavenly bodies, and expanded his rule further into the four directions. After he died, his cousin's son became the third emperor, Emperor KU again. KU

was born a genius. Yeah, yeah, they're all geniuses. Apparently he was also selfless, thrifty, humane, fair and dignified. He invented the calendar, and there was no one in the Empire who did not respect him. He married two women. The first one bore him a son who would become emperor, Yao. But before Yao became an

emperor, his brother Ji ruled before him, but Qi ruled poorly and died soon after. Yao was famous for being meritorious and benevolent and the next emperor, Shun is often used as the model of the perfect ruler by Confucius and many other Confucians after him. Yao brought harmony to his nine

degrees of kin, and he employed people to the right position by meritocracy. He even refused to let his incompetent son hold office. It was also on his rule that China was starting to be plagued by floods, and he employed Guan, the father of Yu, the great, to control the floods. But after nine years,

Guan failed to accomplish his mission and became a pariah. You will try to control this flood much later, your son. Yu are very important figures in Confucianism. What Confucius really admired about Yu was his commitment for meritocracy. Yu did not pass on the throne to his son Dan, who was unfit

to rule, but he looked for the most suitable candidate. Instead, he was then informed of the existence of Shun, a distant relative from Chuan Chu's line. By then, he was just a commoner and from a disreputable family to boot his parents and brother behaved appallingly and even tried to kill him, but due to

his filial piety, he was able to reform them. So Yu sent his two daughters to marry him and observed his behavior. He was impressed that Shun treated them with few ceremony, but Yao wasn't satisfied yet. After putting Shun through a series of tests, which he passed brilliantly, Yao finally decided

to give authority to his son-in-law, the most meritorious Man, instead of his incompetent son. After Yao's death, Shun put Dan on the throne and moved to the southern River. However, the Dukes did not attend Dan's court. They went to Shun instead. Also sang his praise instead of Dan. So he took this as the

will of Heaven and returned to rule as emperor, as you valued meritocracy, so did Shun. Shun appointed you to control the floods that had been plaguing the Empire since Yao's time. Yu worked tirelessly for 13 years, and he did not even visit his own family until his work was done. This is seen as a virtue

by Confucians, but it also pretty much became the basis for toxic Asian work culture after Yu succeeded in taming the floods, history repeated itself. Shun made Yu his minister, and after his death, the Dukes ignored Shun's son and made Yu the ruler instead. And that's how the Xia, the first mythical

Chinese dynasty, started. Actually, Yu also followed the tradition and gave the rulership to a minister. The Minister then passed the throne to Yu's son, Qi. But as it turned out, Qi was more popular than the minister, and he retained power, and that's how the dynasty became hereditary. Of course, since

these events took place over 4000 years ago, it is near impossible to prove them to be true. We have oracle bones that date back to the Shang Dynasty that partially prove the dynasty's existence, but there are no archeological evidence that corresponds with the Xia dynasty or the earlier emperors.

There are plenty of prehistoric human settlements around China, such as the early Neolithic culture and the Longshan culture, which existed from around four to 5000 years ago, but there is no definite proof that these people are the citizens of the Xia Dynasty. The problem is that these kind of prehistoric

settlements are not very rare. There are just too many candidates, and the link between the narrative and the settlement still needed to be proven. Even Chinese historical skeptics from 100 years ago claimed that the three Augusts and five emperors are most likely euhemerized to fit a political narrative. Some

of you may not be familiar with this term, but euhemerization is just the opposite of deification, which is the process of depicting a God as a historical human figure, because in earlier accounts, the Yellow Emperor was worshiped as a god before he was depicted as a historical person. This

euhemerization trend only started around the Warring States period. So it is very unlikely that these Augusts and emperors existed as historical people. This is why the Augusts and emperors are commonly considered to be mythical and legendary by modern historians. But even if they didn't exist,

the narrative is still very powerful, especially when they are considered to be moral exemplars by Confucius. That's why various Confucian societies may want to draw a link to these legendary figures in a later Vietnamese history book. David S. Tu, the first king of the Hong Bang dynasty, King

Zhuang was claimed to be a descendant of Xin Nong, the Yellow Emperor Yao. And Yu were also referenced in the introduction when explaining how the name Yue, or Viet as in Vietnam, originated. Kim Busi, the Korean historian who wrote some Goryeo Sagi during the Goryeo dynasty. Also noticed that there

are historical records that claim that the king of Silla claimed to be the descendants of yellow Emperor's son, and the Goguryeo claimed to be descended from Emperor Ku. Rightfully, he was skeptical of this claim, but this kind of unsubstantiated connection were pretty common. The reason for

this was probably because the Confucian classics were the subjects of Imperial examinations, and virtually all scholars and historians in those countries were Confucian, so they probably claimed these connections to increase the prestige of their own dynasties. But there could also be other

political motives too. Sima Qin claims that the Xiong Lu are descended from Zun Wei, a descendant of the Xia royal family. At the time it was a part of the anti war faction in Han Wu this court. So he might have made that unsubstantiated connection to discourage war against the Xiong lung the

Confucians may not have been the ones who invented the three Augusts and five emperors narrative, but they certainly latched onto its heart. That's why, even when an alternative narrative was presented, because the story of your son and you may not have been as ideal as it was presented in the Orthodox

version. According to the legalist philosopher Han Fei soon usurped Yao, and in turn, you usurp sun. So he suggested that there was actually a power struggle back then. There was also a document called the bamboo annals, which was buried in the tomb of King Xiang of Wei before Jin suhuang Unified.

China and burned the ancient history books and Mars the document was discovered almost 600 years later in the Jing dynasty, according to the bamboo annals, Sun imprisoned Yao and prevented your son dansu from seeing his father. So it goes completely against Confucius narrative. The ancient world may

not have been as utopian as he claimed, after all, and it was probably real politic all the way back. However, there are also issues with this document, because scholars noticed that during the Ming and Qing Dynasty, the content seemed to have changed. So the modern text of this document may have been

altered. Additionally, just because an alternative account exists, it doesn't mean that it had to be true, since we are talking about legendary figures, after all, it just means that an alternative account exists and it also needs to be proven to be true. Anyway. Now that we have got this topic out of the way, I

can talk about Confucianism on the next episode. So if you don't want to miss it, then subscribe. If

so, I want to tell you some cool stuff. So I don't know if you guys picked it up, but if you noticed, he talked about the Yellow Emperor, and he said, What was the Pro? What was the big achievement of the Yellow Emperor, controlling floods. Now, looking into Pakistan's history, and this is where I

fell into this rabbit hole. They were talking about this great flood around 3000 BC. But we're told that, hey, biscuit, you want to say hi? Um, we're told that Noah's Flood was around 5000 BC. Now we don't know. I mean, you know, when you're looking so far back into history, right into ancient

times, you know, dates get skewed. But his biggest achievement was controlling the floods. And if you remember, he assigned his son to control these floods that were plaguing the world, the world, right? The world. They were playing yes biscuit. They were Yes, you want to come over here, come here.

Boy, come here. Let me get you look his first going back from his little surgeries and stuff. So they were literally, we had massive floods, somewhere between 5003 1000 BC plaguing the world, which is, you know, Christianity places it around 5000 BC. The Greek empire, history places it around 3500

BC. So we're plus or minus 1000 years. But I just wanted to say, like, you know, it's like 1000 years, no big deal, right? A whole millennia. A lot can happen in a millennia, right? He's purring into the microphone. So that's pretty interesting. I just wanted to say, I am. I kind of want to

throw it out there, because with the mythology in Greece, they also talk about these floods and how to control them. So that's pretty fascinating. Now, another fascinating thing, and I was kind of trying to look around to find it, is that the origin of Christmas, and now a lot of people go into the pagan thing,

and, you know, it's Jesus's birth, which I would, you know, correlate with the with the birth of the of the North Star, because there's one specific heavenly body nobody talks about. Now, last year, they talked about it, but it was kind of wasn't a big deal. But I think it's important now only

because it's a little bit differently active because of today, actually, it's physically more active. And I want to show you I have two videos. Hold on, I want to see where I put the other one here. Oh gosh darn it. Where did I say that? Let me take a look. It's under that one. Okay, so I want to show you

a tick tock video that I found first, and then I'm going to show you a long form video, and then we're going to end it. This is all Christmas, by the way, so apparently, and I heard this story just so, you know, from a rabbi, actually. And the discussion was when I was a kid in Jerusalem, and it was a rabbi

Because if you have no knowledge, then you have no want to be free. Like, why? Why know something? Why care?

Why this? Why that. I also prepared a video for you on the outro with a song for you to listen to. I'd like you to pay attention to the visuals too. Um, but here's the long form video on this beautiful Christmas tree that was first get this recorded. Um, by King Herod. And I don't know why

Hey, you haven't published this yet, and

it's like, oh, how do I tell them I'm not in academia, right? But um, you know, I needed to find the answer. And it was very simple. I looked at the biology of things that we know at the time, and this is how I deduce problems. And hopefully you can learn from it, because it's a fantastic strategy. You, you,

you focus on what the, what the, what the, what the gap is, where's the vacuum of information that's missing? Like, where is it? Like, you're telling me algae said, One day I'm gonna go on land. And it's like, Okay, that's pretty weird. I'm happy here in the water. Why would I leave? So, you know, the

professor was like, well, maybe there was something with the water. And I'm like, Okay, well, what was with the water? He's like, I don't know. Like, I don't know. We don't have any any documentation. So I scoured through documents. Went to a laboratory, and no answers, ha, but I found them in physics,

because I was TA in physics at the time, and so I asked the physics professor. I was like, hey, you know, can you This is just a dumb question, and he was really cool, because he's from the University of Kentucky. He had a mustache like that, curled like literally, he looked like Wario. Anyway, he was like,

You're the only TA for physics that doesn't is not a physics major, but you're good at it. I said, All right, so I answer this question. You know, who decided to calculate gravity to 9.8 meters per second squared? And he just looked at me. He's like, Well, those are the calculations. I said, Yeah, but

how do you know where's the book? Let me see it. Because I'm like, that's the thing gravity. Oh. He's like, No, we just know it from dinosaurs. So that would be air pressure, and that would affect water. He's like, Yeah. And I was like, well, the but the ice cores that I read when I did

that eco thing said that there was more carbon, you know, before the dinosaur. She goes, Oh, yeah, yeah. That's a circadian thing. And I think it's because plant life came up, they started to exude a lot of oxygen. So that's why it became fully oxygenated, and that's why we got shit so big. He's like,

you know, if you put a baby in a place with like, 100% oxygen, it's gonna grow to be a giant. And I was like, wait, what? So then I took another class, and then another class, and then when I by the time I got to physiology part two, I was like, I know what paper I'm doing. I'm going to answer the question of

why plants migrated to land, and this is it. There was a lot of carbon dioxide right prior to the dinosaurs. And we know this from the ice cores. This is how you solve problems. You go to find where you're missing something. So I'm putting out the paper that I should have published years ago, because I

don't care I like what that I'm going to get a paper that says that I'm smart. I already know that I'm smart. I'm one of the smartest people in the world. I don't need a paper to tell me. But here's, here's how I saw this. So the the algae that was there, because there was so much carbon dioxide, right? It

actually increased pressure. Now that pressure, the changes in atmospheric pressure, obviously affect water too. But here's the other thing that I realized, the measure of gravity would change as well. Gravity would be less so it was not hospitable to algae, and this is why. They moved to land. This is why

algae, you know, over a long period of time, right, transferred itself to land. And you know, in its emergence onto the terrestrial territory, we found eukaryotes. And if you know the first eukaryotes that were organisms, you know, that are what, what create humans. They're eukaryotes, not mono

cellular, right? They were actually with like armor, because the pressure of the air was so heavy, because the gravity was so strong, right? So when we see the algae, the first plants that were like these, just green things, and they were like small. At that time, they discovered that they found

armored right insects, like armored things. They were tiny, but they had like an exoskeleton, which would infer that they needed protection, obviously from the elements, but also it created like they assumed that it was like a pressure vacuum or something like that. But anyway, that

algae then turned out to be plants that had nothing. They didn't look anything like. They looked alien. They were just these green stems and green spongy things with big holes in them, and they were just green, and they were just constantly eating up the carbon dioxide, which then increased the oxygen,
